Dear Commissioner Afable and Deputy Commissioner Houdek:

On behalf of the Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW), and MCW's Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin (AHW) Endowment, we are seeking approval for AHW's program audit process.

Program audits are required as indicated in the following clause in the March 28, 2000 order from the Wisconsin Commissioner of Insurance:

PROGRAM AND FINANCIAL AUDITS

At least every five years the University of Wisconsin Foundation/University of Wisconsin Medical School and the Medical College of Wisconsin shall obtain a program and financial audit from the Legislative Audit Bureau or from an independent firm approved by, or selected under standards approved by, the Commissioner, and shall submit the audit report to the PCHOAC, Board of Regents or Board of Trustees, and the Wisconsin United for Health Foundation, Inc., if still in existence.

AHW's past practice has been to conduct a program audit every five years, with the most recent audit completed for the period of January 1, 2014 to December 31, 2018. We are seeking approval to conduct the program audit annually. To accomplish the shift in timeline, an audit for the period of January 1, 2019 to June 30, 2021 is being proposed, with annual audits thereafter beginning for the period of July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022. We request the program audits be conducted by KPMG, through an agreed-upon procedures approach, as is consistent with the most recently completed audit. Conducting annual program audits will allow for more timely reports being made available to the public. AHW requests no change to the financial audit process, which is conducted annually by KPMG.

Thank you for your consideration of this request. We look forward to your response, along with continued partnership with you and your staff. If any additional information is needed, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Independent Accountants' Agreed-Upon Procedures Report

To The Medical College of Wisconsin, Inc.:

We have performed the procedures enumerated below related to The Medical College of Wisconsin's (MCW) compliance with the Order issued by the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance of the State of Wisconsin in the Finding of Fact, Conclusion of Law, and Order issued March 28, 2000 (the Order) as applied to the Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Program (the Program) for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. MCW is responsible for its compliance with the Order's requirements.

MCW has agreed to and acknowledged that the procedures performed are appropriate to meet the intended purpose of determining its compliance with the Order's requirements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. This report may not be suitable for any other purpose. Additionally, the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance of the State of Wisconsin has agreed to and acknowledged that the procedures performed are appropriate for its purposes. No other parties have agreed to or acknowledged the appropriateness of these procedures for the intended purpose or any other purpose.

The procedures performed may not address all the items of interest to a user of this report and may not meet the needs of all users of this report and, as such, users are responsible for determining whether the procedures performed are appropriate for their purposes. We make no representation regarding the appropriateness of the procedures either for the intended purpose or for any other purpose.

The procedures and the associated findings are as follows:

1. Inquire of management whether an independent annual financial audit covering grant and administrative expense between July 1, 2024 and June 30, 2025, has been completed in compliance with the Insurance Commissioner's Order.

We obtained from management the audited financial statements of the Program for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

2. For each reporting period obtain management's summary schedule of the Program expenditures by award granted and amounts charged as administrative expenses. Agree total expenditures to the amount shown as the Program expenditures in the corresponding financial statement audit for fiscal year ending June 30, 2025. Management's summary schedule of the Program expenditures should be presented by award and include the following: amount awarded, amount expended in period, amount unspent at period end and total for all amounts expended. (Attach as Schedule 1)

We obtained from management the summary schedule of the Program expenditures by award granted and amounts charged as administrative expenses for both the Public Health Initiatives (Fund 151) awards and the Medical Education and Research initiatives (Fund 152) awards for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. We reconciled total expenditures to the amount shown as the Program expenditures in the corresponding financial statement audit for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure. See Schedule 1 attached.



3. Obtain management's schedule of the endowment balance at fiscal year ending June 30, 2025 and agree it to the corresponding audited financial statements of the Program. (Attach as Schedule 2)

We obtained management's schedule of the endowment balance as of the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025 and agreed it to the endowment balance within the respective audited financial statements of the Program.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure. See Schedule 2 attached.

4. Obtain and read the Program minutes of governance committee meetings. Verify the minutes provide documentation of award decisions. Verify the minutes provide documentation of financial reporting at least annually, on the value of the endowment and available funds.

We obtained and read the Program minutes of the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health and AHW Research and Education Advisory Committee for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. Per our review of the minutes, we observed the minutes included award decisions and at least annually, the financial reporting on the value of the endowment and funds available for disbursements.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

5. Obtain each member of the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health, and the Research and Education Advisory Committee's sign-off from management confirming their agreement to adhere to the Program's respective committee conflict of interest policies.

We obtained the annual sign-offs for each of the members of MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025 and sign-off for each of the Research and Education Advisory Committee members for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. The sign-offs contained each member's confirmation of their agreement to adhere to the Program's respective conflict of interest policies.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

6. Inquire of management as to whether or not the entity charges administrative expenses to the Program. If an administrative expense was charged, obtain a schedule of administrative expenses from management and agree it to the respective financial statements noted in procedure 2 above. Compute the amount of administrative expenses to the average monthly endowment value for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025. Compute the amount of administrative expenses to the total program expenditures for the same period. (Attach as Schedule 3A)

We inquired of management noting that MCW does charge administrative expenses to the Program. We obtained management's schedule of administrative expenses at the transaction detail level and agreed it to the financial statements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. We also computed the amount of administrative expenses to the average monthly endowment value and the amount of administrative expenses to total program expenditures for the same period.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure. See Schedule 3A attached.

7. Select a sample of five administrative expense transactions from the public health awards and a sample of five administrative expense transactions from the medical education and research awards listed in the schedule obtained in procedure 6 for the period July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025. Vouch back to supporting documentation to ascertain that the administrative expenses related to the Program. (Attach a summary of amounts tested by period as Schedule 3B)



From management's schedule of administrative expenses obtained in procedure 6, we selected 5 administrative expense transactions for each of the public health and medical education and research awards for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. We performed the following procedures:

- a. For external expenses, we obtained from management the invoice, purchase order (if applicable), and check copy or remittance advice, or expense report and check copy or remittance advice, and agreed the amount to the schedule of administrative expenses, verifying that the administrative expense related to the Program.
- b. For salaries expenses, we obtained the Labor Distribution Report and Personnel Activity Report and agreed the amount to the administrative expense schedule, verifying that the administrative expense related to the Program.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure. See Schedule 3B attached.

8. Inquire of management as to whether or not the Program has program support project expenses. If there are program support projects, obtain a schedule of expenses from management and agree it to the respective financial statements noted in procedure 2 above. (Attach as Schedule 3C)

We inquired of management noting that MCW does have program support project expenses. We obtained management's schedule of expenses and agreed it to the financial statements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure. See Schedule 3C attached.

9. Select a sample of five program support project expense transactions from the public health awards and a sample of five program support project expense transactions from the medical education and research awards listed in the schedule obtained in procedure 8 for the period of July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025. Vouch back to supporting documentation to ascertain that the programmatic expenses related to the Program. (Attach a summary of amounts tested by period as Schedule 3D)

From management's schedule of program support project expenses obtained in procedure 8, we selected 5 program support project expense transactions for each of the public health and medical education and research awards for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. We performed the following procedures:

- a. For external expenses, we obtained from management the invoice, purchase order (if applicable), and check copy or remittance advice or expense report and check copy or remittance advice, agreed the amount to the schedule of expenses, and verified that the programmatic expense related to the Program.
- b. For salaries expenses, we obtained the Labor Distribution Report and Personnel Activity Report and agreed the amount to the schedule of expenses, verifying that the programmatic expense related to the Program.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure. See Schedule 3D attached.

10. Inquire of management as to whether or not the Program has expenses supporting programmatic efforts led by Program faculty directors. If there are expenses supporting programmatic efforts led by Program faculty directors, obtain a schedule of expenses from management and agree it to the respective financial statements noted in Procedure 2 above. (Attach as Schedule 3E).

We inquired of management noting that MCW does have expenses supporting programmatic efforts led by Program faculty directors. We obtained management's schedule of expenses and agreed it to the financial statements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025.



No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure. See Schedule 3E attached.

11. Inquire of management whether the Program reported annually on programmatic efforts led by Program faculty directors, demonstrating expenses were in alignment with original intent of funds as approved by the MCW Board of Trustees, noting date of report or planned report, and date of approval of funds.

We inquired of management noting that the Program reported annually on programmatic efforts led by Program faculty directors. We obtained support that demonstrated the expenses were in alignment with the original intent of funds as approved by the MCW Board of Trustees, noting the date of report on November 21, 2024 and date of approval of funds on June 23, 2023.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

Compliance with Insurance Commissioner's Order

12. Inquire whether management has prepared a five-year plan for the Program which was active for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025. Obtain documentation that public input was sought in developing the plan, that the relevant sections of the plan were approved by the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health noting the date of approval, and that the plan was approved by the MCW Board of Trustees noting the date of approval.

We inquired of management noting a five-year plan was prepared for the program for the period 2024 through 2028. We obtained the Program's Stakeholder Engagement Process Document for the 2024 – 2028 five-year plan, showing the different ways MCW requested public comments and the outcome of each. We inspected the meeting minutes of the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health on May 4, 2023, noting the approval 2024 – 2028 five-year plan. We obtained a certified letter from M. Aileen Shinaman, Assistant Secretary and General Counsel of MCW that stated the date of the MCW Board of Trustees approved the Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment 2024 – 2028 five-year plan on June 23, 2023.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

13. Obtain evidence showing the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health conducted and recorded a vote on the allocated percentage of funds for public health initiatives and for medical education and research initiatives in accordance with the five-year plan in effect at the time of the vote for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025.

We obtained the meeting minutes of the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health evidencing they conducted and recorded the vote on the allocation percentage of funds for public health initiatives and for medical education and research initiatives in accordance with the five-year plan on May 4, 2023 to retain the allocation for the 2024 – 2028 five-year plan.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

14. Obtain evidence of separate endowment accounts for public health initiatives and for medical education and research initiatives. Inquire of management as to whether the endowment funds were pooled with other endowment funds in a common investment management practice.

We obtained management's schedules of endowment balances noted in procedure 3, noting there were separate endowment accounts for public health initiatives and for medical education and research initiatives. We inquired of management as to whether the Program endowment funds were pooled with other endowment funds of MCW in a common investment management practice noting that the Program endowment is pooled with other funds at MCW for investment purposes. The pooled endowment accounting policy is disclosed in the notes to the audited financial statements identified in procedure 1.



No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

15. Inquire of management whether the entity completed annual reports on endowment-funded activities. Obtain evidence the reports were approved by the MCW Board of Trustees. Obtain evidence the reports were made available to the public.

We obtained the annual reports on endowment-funded activities for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2024, which is the latest annual report issued. Management indicated the website where the reports were made available to the public. Each report was obtained from the AHW Public Stewardship website (ahwendowment.org/AHW/Who-We-Are/Public-Stewardship.htm). We obtained a certified letter from M. Aileen Shinaman, Assistant Secretary and General Counsel of MCW that stated the date of the MCW Board of Trustees accepted the Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment Annual Reports for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2024 on November 12, 2024.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

16. Inquire of management whether the membership composition of the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health was consistent with the requirements of the Insurance Commissioner's Order.

We obtained the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance's Order on membership composition of the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health. We obtained from management a listing of MCW Consortium members for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025 and agreed the listing of MCW Consortium members to the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance's Order.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

17. Inquire of management whether the Program has a policy on non-supplanting.

We obtained the Program's policy named "AHW Non-Supplanting Policy" that covers the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

Grant Review and Awards

18. Using the list of awards obtained in procedure 2, select a sample of the lesser of 10 public health awards and 10 medical education and research awards <u>or</u> awards that represent 20% of total expenses for each category of awards, active between July 1, 2024 and June 30, 2025.

We obtained the summary schedules of the Program expenditures by award granted noted in procedure 2 and selected 3 public health awards and 6 medical education and research awards active during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. These selections represented at least 20% of total expenses for each category of awards active during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

- 19. For each award selected in procedure 18 verify that the award documentation includes the following items:
 - a. Letter of intent (if required) with evidence of review and approval in accordance with the relevant RFA if applicable
 - b. Full application with evidence of review and approval in accordance with the relevant RFA if applicable
 - c. Documentation of non-supplanting review in alignment with the Program's non-supplanting policy
 - d. Award letter or funding agreement indicating the amount awarded and funding period



- e. Documentation that budget and budget revisions (if requested) were approved in accordance with the relevant award administration manual, and indicate personnel expenses including base salaries that were at or below the NIH salary cap (if required) in the relevant RFA
- f. Documentation of changes to the award funding period (if requested)
- g. Award recipient orientation materials in accordance with the relevant award administration manual
- h. Progress and final reporting requirements (if required) in accordance with the relevant award administration manual

Prepare and attach Schedule 4 to summarize results.

We performed the procedures outlined above for each award selected in procedure 18, as applicable, and obtained from management the following documentation to apply the procedures:

- a. Obtained the applicant's letter of intent (if required) and/or invitation that included the Program's review and approval in accordance with the relevant RFA component to include confirmation of applicant eligibility.
- b. Obtained the full application submitted (if required) and Board Meeting minutes that indicated review and approval of the full application in accordance with the relevant RFA component.
- c. Obtained the applicants completed non-supplanting questionnaire that was completed to support their understanding of the entity's non-supplanting policy and signed by the lead academic partner and principal investigator.
- d. Obtained the original award letters or MOU (if applicable) containing the amount awarded and the period funds were available. Obtained the change request form and MOU Addendum (if applicable) or changes to the award amount or period of award, if applicable. We agreed award amounts to amounts in procedure 19a and 19b.
- e. Obtained the original budgets and any revised budgets with change requests (if applicable). We verified Program approval of the budget(s) by obtaining the e-mail sent to the award recipient with the approved budget spreadsheet. We confirmed base salaries of personnel expenses included in the budget were below the published NIH salary cap as required by the RFA component.
- f. We obtained the No Cost Extension (if applicable) recording the changing of the period of the award.
- g. We obtained the power point presentation of the award orientation.
- h. We obtained the applicable progress and final reports noting the submission dates agreed with the award and policies.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure. See Schedule 4 attached.

Monitoring Awards

20. For each award selected in procedure 18 obtain the underlying detailed list of expenditures during the period. Using this detailed list, select 5 transactions at the lowest level of detail available per award.

We obtained, for each award selected in procedure 18, a detailed list of expenditures during the period and selected 5 transactions at the lowest level of detail available for each award such as a specific invoice or individual payroll support.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.



21. For the sample selected in procedure 20, obtain supporting documentation for each expense selected and verify that it was spent during the grant period and was approved as being in accordance with the award. Reference allowable/unallowable section of the relevant award administration manual. Prepare and attach as Schedule 5 a summary showing the name of the award, amount of award, amount of expenditures tested and coverage percentage.

For each expense selected in procedure 20, we agreed the expense was dated within the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025 and verified the expense was approved by the designated responsible party via their signature or payment support signifying approval as being in accordance with the award and as being for an allowable cost via the approved award budget or the certification statement on the Financial Status report.

- a. For external expenses, we obtained the invoice, budget approval and check copy or remittance advice or expense report and check copy or remittance advice and agreed the amount to the amount selected per the underlying detailed list of expenditures, transactions and supporting documentation.
- b. For payroll expenses, we obtained the employee's approved budget data form showing the employee's percentage of time allocated to the Program to support a portion of the employee's salary or fringe benefit being charged to the Program.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure. See Schedule 5A and 5B attached.

22. For each award selected in procedure 18, inquire of management whether there were awards with sub-projects.

For each award selected in procedure 18, we inquired of management whether there were sub-recipients related to the award. Management noted that of the 9 awards selected in procedure 18, 2 of the awards had sub-projects. Those 2 awards are:

Public Health Awards

- Advancing Behavioral Health Initiative Phase 3: Academic Partner Team
- Sustaining a Behavioral Health System in Marathon County

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

23. For awards identified in procedure 22 that have sub-projects, select a sample of public health sub-projects and medical education and research sub-projects that represent at least one-third of total sub-projects of each parent award. The sample selection should not include the parent award.

For each award with sub-projects identified within procedure 22, we selected sub-projects that represented at least one-third of the total expenses of the initial award (parent award) selected in procedure 18. In the event the sub-projects expenses did not account for at least one-third of the total expenses of the initial award (parent award) selected in Procedure 18, we selected all sub-projects.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

24. For each subproject selected in procedure 23, verify with management that the required reporting documents (items listed in procedure 19 A through H above) were submitted in accordance with the original award and policies.

For each sub-project selected within procedure 23, we performed the procedures listed in procedure 19, as applicable.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.



We were engaged by MCW to perform this agreed-upon procedures engagement. We conducted our engagement in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, which involves us performing the specific procedures agreed to and acknowledged above and reporting on findings based on performing those procedures. We were not engaged to and did not conduct an examination or review, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion or conclusion, respectively, on MCW's compliance with the Order's requirements for the period from July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion or conclusion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

We are required to be independent of MCW and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements related to our agreed-upon procedures engagement.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of The Medical College of Wisconsin, Inc. and the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance of the State of Wisconsin, and is not intended to be, and should not be, used by anyone other than the specified parties.
