7	THE HEARING EXAMINER: I call this
8	informational hearing today to order at 2 p.m.,
9	October 16, 2001. I'm Matthew C. Mandt, the
10	director of the Bureau of Financial Analysis and
11	Examinations, presiding as hearing examiner over
12	Case No. 00-C26776, concerning the restructuring of
13	Employers Insurance of Wausau, a mutual company,
14	under a mutual holding company plan.
15	This hearing is being held at the Founders
16	Room in the Hilton Madison Monona Terrace, Madison,
17	Wisconsin at 2 p.m. on Tuesday, October 16, 2001
18	pursuant to Chapter 227, Sections 601.62 and 644.07
19	of the Wisconsin Statutes.
20	This hearing is being held to receive
21	informational public comments, both oral and
22	written, concerning the restructuring of Employers
23	Insurance of Wausau, a mutual company, under a
24	mutual holding company plan. The proceedings are
25	being transcribed by Professional Reporters, Ltd.

At this hearing anyone from the public may testify or file a written comment. Witnesses who testify are asked to keep to a time limit of no more than five minutes unless otherwise permitted and are encouraged to file additional written comments if they wish to do so.

Immediately preceding this public hearing a class one contested case hearing was concluded regarding the restructuring of Employers Insurance of Wausau, a mutual company, under a mutual holding company plan. The transcript of this hearing, any written testimony introduced and any comments received by the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance on or before 5 p.m. on October 26, 2001 will become part of the record for the restructuring of Employers Insurance of Wausau, a mutual company, under a mutual holding company plan.

No oath will be administered to anyone who testifies. At this time Walter Blaedel has asked to provide some testimony. So would you like to go ahead.

MR. BLAEDEL: Yes, please. We name is Walter J. Blaedel. My address and phone number are One Kessel Court, Apartment 5, in Madison,

1	Wisconsin, 53711. My phone number is 608-276-9775.
2	I've been a resident, property owner and renter in
3	the City of Madison since 1947.
4	I was a member of the UW-Madison Chemistry
5	Department, specializing in analytical chemistry
6	until my retirement in 1981. More details are
7	given in the Document 2741 that I would like to
8	submit as an exhibit. I have a number of copies of
9	these, and I would like to distribute them to
10	members of the audience. May I go on?
11	THE HEARING EXAMINER: Yes, go
12	ahead.
13	MR. BLAEDEL: I'm objecting to these
14	proceedings, and I intend to make my objections in
15	my own person and without attorney and without
16	acting as an attorney, according to my rights under
17	Article 1, Sections 7, 9 and 21 of the Wisconsin
18	Constitution. I refuse to hire an attorney, and I
19	will not accept assignment of an attorney.
20	In case those of you who have forgotten
21	constitutional rights, I would like to submit a
22	copy of the constitution as another exhibit.
23	THE HEARING EXAMINER: Okay.
24	MR. NEPPLE: Do you have any
25	additional exhibits?

1	MR. BLAEDEL: After this perhaps one
2	more, perhaps.
3	THE HEARING EXAMINER: Please
4	continue.
5	MR. BLAEDEL: The basis of my
6	objection is that the prosecution of a fabricated
7	traffic citation by City of Middleton Police
8	Officer Steven Britt against my wife, Barbara J.
9	Blaedel, on April 10 was screwed up by intervention
10	of Timothy J. Yanacheck, who was an employee of the
11	Liberty Mutual Group.
12	Yanacheck's intervention is compoundedly
13	screwing up our already screwed up corrupt legal
14	system in Dane County, Wisconsin. Details of
15	Yanacheck's intervention are given in this exhibit
16	I won't go into them in detail, and I have extra
17	copies. I'd like any excess returned.
18	THE HEARING EXAMINER: Go ahead.
19	MR. BLAEDEL: I will submit all of
20	the exhibits.
21	THE HEARING EXAMINER: Okay. Thank
22	you.
23	MR. BLAEDEL: I'd like to give what
24	I call a narrative, which I think would amount to
25	testimony if I were under oath.

THE HEARING EXAMINER: That's fine.

MR. BLAEDEL: I visited the OCI on

Friday, September 14 and explained my interest in

the prehearing conference to Steven Junior. The

newspaper article was completely unreadable and

unintelligible. Junior gave me a more legible copy

of the public notice and he explained the protocol

and location of the prehearing conference.

I was aghast at the size, which is over 200 pages, and the complexity of the policyholder information statement, so Junior let me borrow his copy and also a copy of the policyholder guide over the weekend so I could study it before the conference.

The prehearing conference was highly informal and seemed to be appearances of lawyers involved in the restructuring. For my appearance I explained my interest briefly, stating that I wanted a copy of the transcript and a copy of the policyholder information statement.

I was promised a copy of the statement by Mr. Hoffert and he sent me one, and a copy of -Fred Nepple, general counsel, promised me a copy of the transcript, and I picked up a copy of the transcript from Mr. Junior on September 26. He

also explained the protocol for the hearing of October 16, that is today's.

That evening I studied the transcript and to my dismay I found nothing of my participation in the prehearing conference. Only my name was listed among the appearances as also present.

At that time I decided to object, and to assist my objection I visited OCI on October 1st and 4th to obtain a printout of the docket for this case, and I was told OCI did not issue dockets.

The basis of my objection and intervention will be, first, the omission from the transcript of my requests and Hoffert's and Nepple's promises to me comprise three counts of the 946.72(1) Wisconsin Statutes, tampering with public records and notices, a Class D felony, punishable by fine and or imprisonment up to \$10,000 and five years per count, and three counts that makes \$30,000 and 15 years.

Second basis is that OCI's failure to issue docket printouts is in violation of Section 946.12(1) Wisconsin Statutes, misconduct in public office, Class E felony, punishable of fine and/or imprisonment up to \$10,000 and two years.

This concludes -- what I'm trying to do is

1	to object and perhaps intervene, but I don't know
2	how. This concludes my objection. Thank you,
3	gentlemen.
4	THE HEARING EXAMINER: Okay. Thank
5	you, very much.
6	MR. BLAEDEL: I have here basically
7	an outline of the comments I've made, and I'd like
8	to submit that as another exhibit.
9	THE HEARING EXAMINER: Thank you for
10	your comments.
11	MR. BLAEDEL: Thank you, sir.
12	THE HEARING EXAMINER: Does anybody
13	else wish to appear?
14	(No response)
15	THE HEARING EXAMINER: Okay. Nobody
16	wishes to appear. I'd like to thank you for your
17	testimony and written comments on the restructuring
18	of Employers Insurance of Wausau, a mutual company,
19	under a mutual holding company plan, which may be

21	October 26, 2001.
